- 1) Associated Student Body Student Activities/Clubs/Athletics Fundraising/Fees/Donations
- 2) Transportation Vehicle Fund Purchase of the Yellow Buses Transportation Levies/State Funding
- 3) Capital Projects Fund Major Capital Projects Capital Projects Levies/Technology Levies
- 4) **Debt Service Fund** Long-Term Borrowing Activities (Bonds) *Voted/Non-Voted Debt & Bond Levies*
- **5) General Fund** Everything Else, Day-To-Day Operations *M&O Levies/State/Federal/Other*



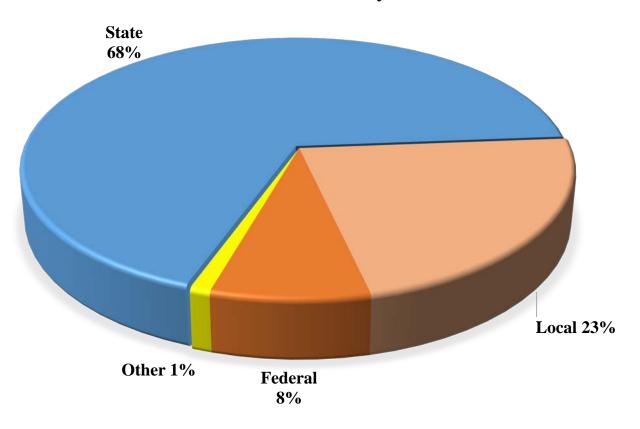

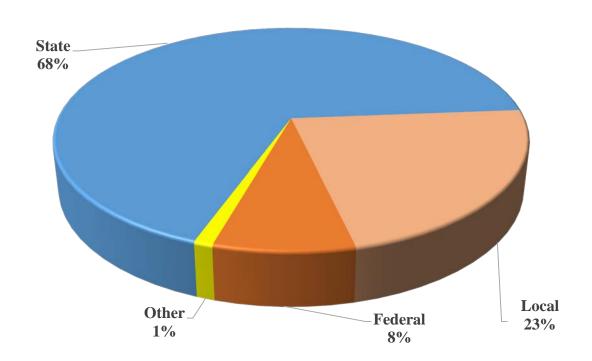


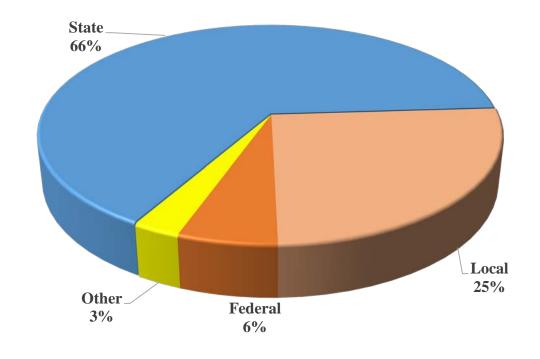


How Does MVSD Compare?

FY2014-15 MVSD General Fund Revenues By Source



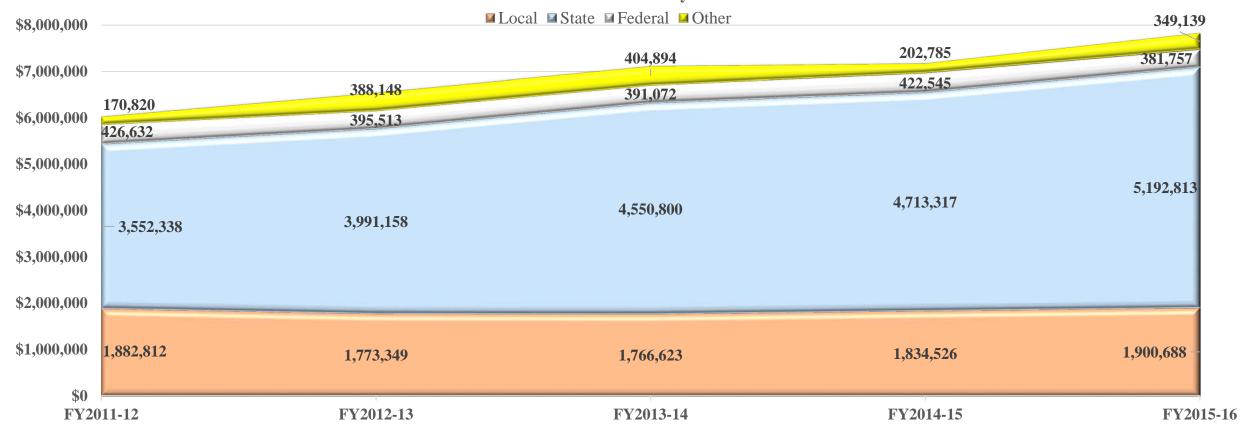






Current MVSD Revenue Trends

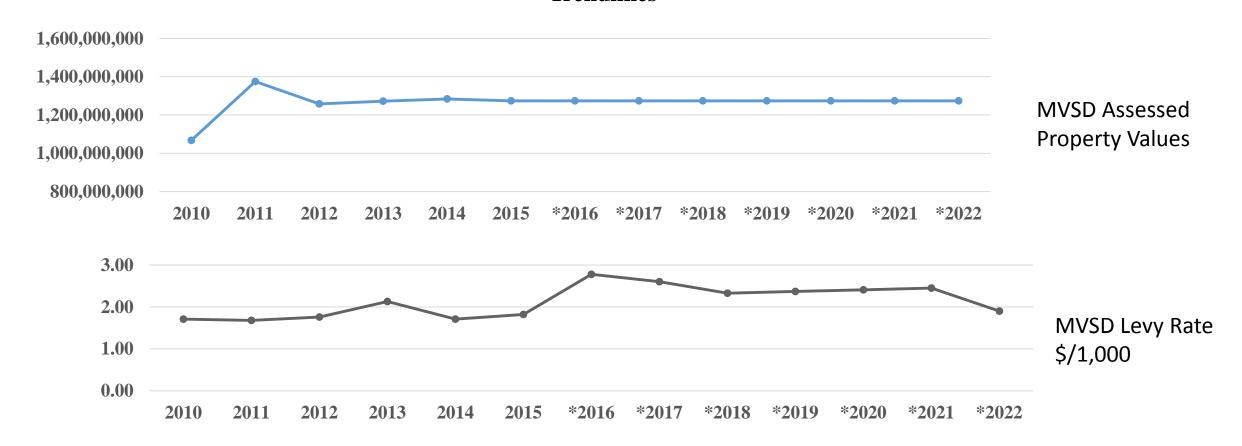

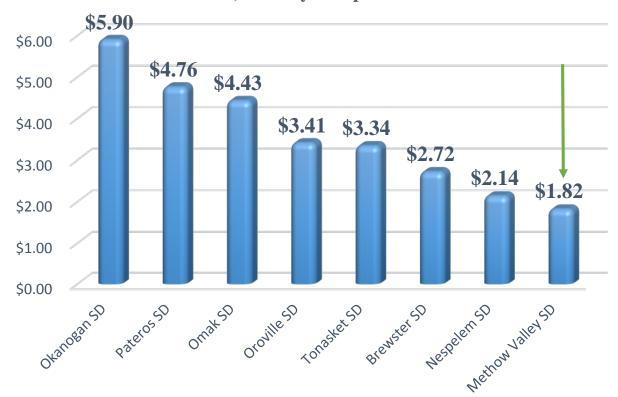

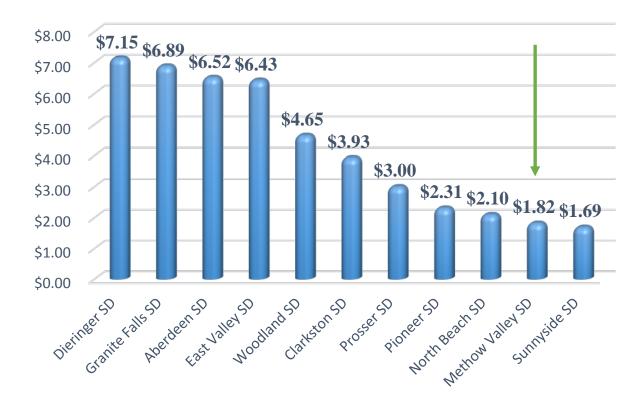

• The Methow Valley School District's current four-year Maintenance and Operations (M&O) and Technology levies supporting the district's educational programs, maintenance and operations, and technologies are set to expire at the end of 2016.

• These two replacement levies combined, fund approximately 26% of the district's annual operating budget.
